On May 7th, Governor Mike DeWine announced updates on Responsible RestartOhio, the statewide initiative to reopen businesses that were closed in response to the coronavirus pandemic. Assuming restaurants are implementing best practices to promote physical distancing and prevent the spread of germs, they will be permitted to open for outdoor dining on May 15th and for dine-in service on May 21st. Personal care services will also be able to start opening on May 15th (salons, barbershops, tanning, etc).
