Overview

The purpose of the survey was to:

- Help understand what Heights residents see as priorities in terms of sustainability issues
- Generate questions for the upcoming community "Crowdsourced Conversation" on sustainability,
 co-hosted by FutureHeights and the Cleveland Heights Green Team

This survey was jointly developed by the Cleveland Heights Green Team and FutureHeights

Responses were anonymous, and participants were told they could skip any questions they do not wish to answer.

The survey was active in March 2022


A total of 200 responses were received

Who Responded

- 98% responded as individuals rather than organizations
- 95% lived in Cleveland Heights
- 74% female
- 50% were 60 years of age or older
- 90% white
- 89% had a Bachelor's degree or more


Thoughts on Environmental Issues

Overall Concern About Local Environmental Issues



The majority of respondents were very concerned about local environmental issues (53.6%)

Importance of Issues




Not important at all

- Climate change had the most frequent "important" rating (92.4%), followed by trash, litter, waste reduction, recycling, and composting (91.8%)
- Noise pollution had the least frequent "important" rating (58.8%)

Willingness to Take Action on Issues




- Respondents were most likely to be "very willing" to take action on trash, litter, waste reduction, recycling, and composting (65.5%), followed by climate change (60.7%)
- They were least likely to be willing to take action on noise pollution (15.4%)

Any issue you're concerned about that was not listed above?

- A total of 51 respondents (25.5%) listed another issue not already provided
- The most common themes in free-text responses were surrounding equity and justice, followed by pesticide use, herbicide use, rat poison use, affordable housing, plastic packaging, and light pollution
- 54% said they would be very willing to take action on the issue they listed




How interested would you be in participating in any of the following initiatives?








City


What city do you live in? 198 responses

Neighborhood, Among Cleveland Heights Residents




 Cedar Lee was the most commonly reported Cleveland Heights neighborhood, followed by Coventry and Noble






- Nearly 90% identified as white

Associate degree (e.g. AA, AS)	2 (1.0%)
Bachelor's degree (e.g. BA, BS)	67 (33.8%)
Master's degree (e.g. MA, MS, MEd)	81 (40.9%)
Professional or Doctorate degree (e.g. MD, DDS, DVM, PhD)	29 (14.6%)

89% of respondents had a bachelor's degree or more, with the most common education category being a master's degree (40.9%)

If you provided another issue, how willing are you to take action on that issue?

Neutral	7 (14.6%)
Fairly willing	10 (20.8%)
Very willing	26 (54.2%)

Of those who provided another issue and willingness rating, more than half said they would be very willing to take action on that issue (54.2%)
